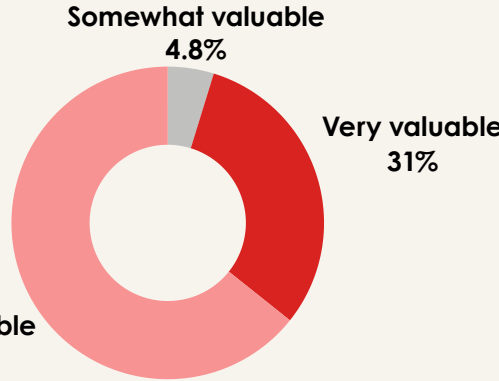

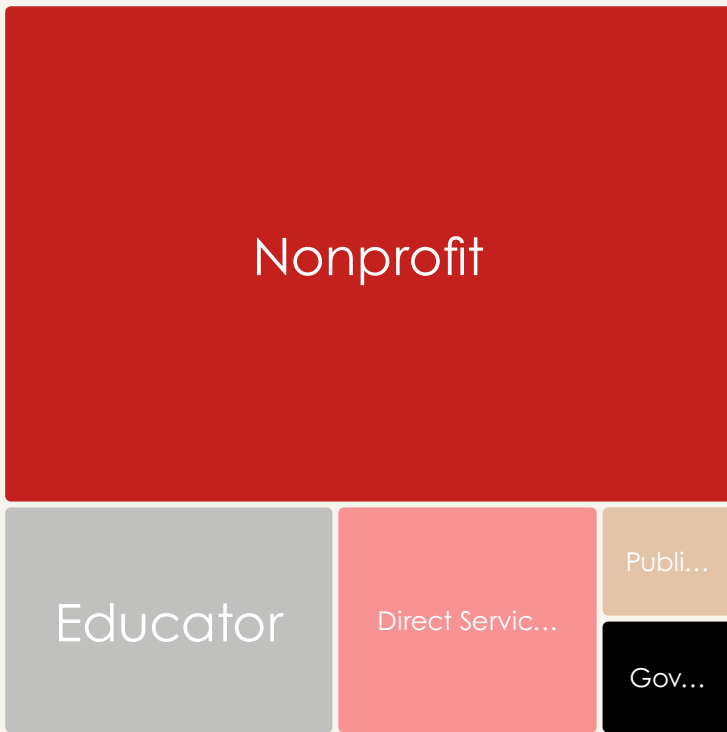

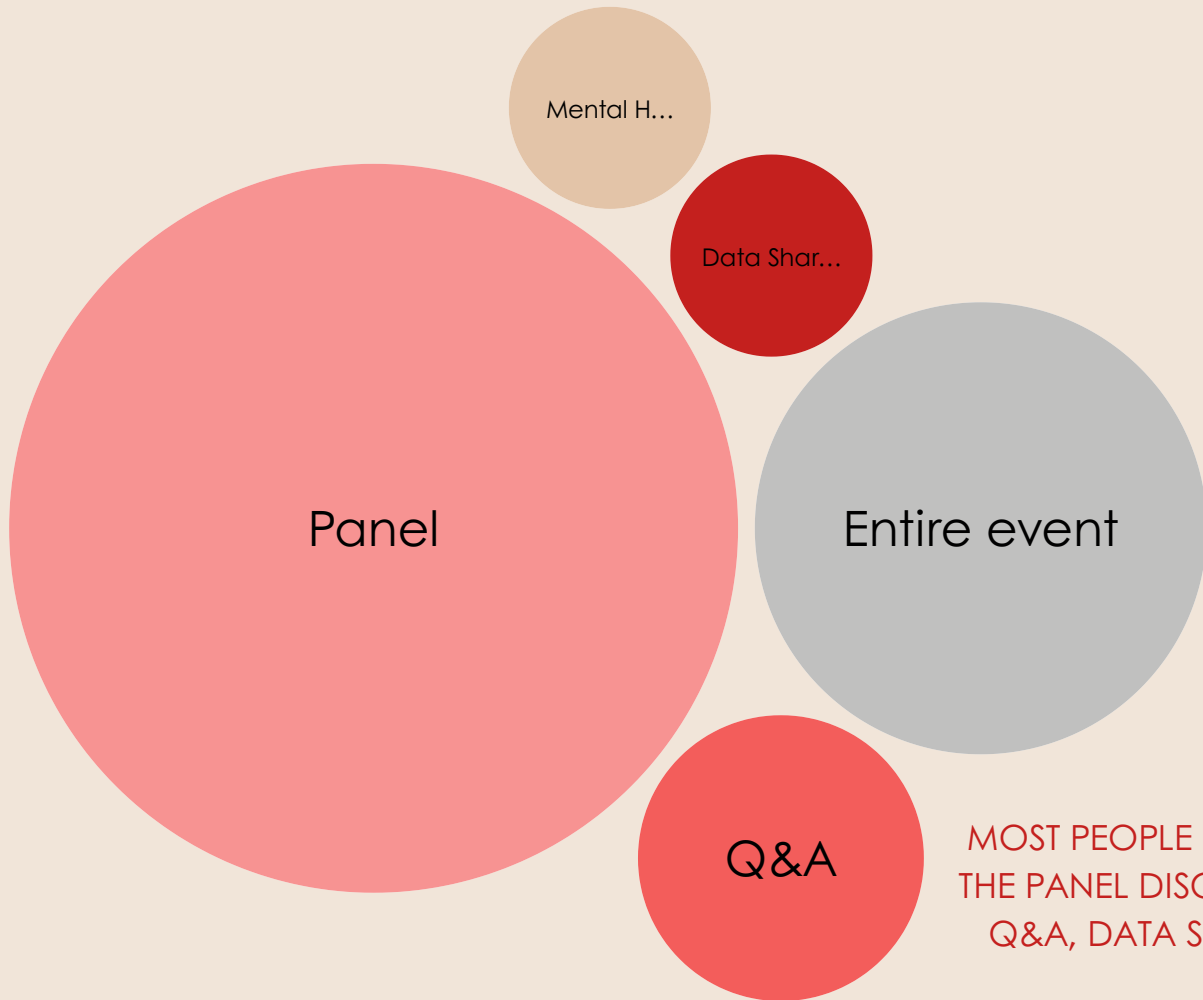
WHAT WAS YOUR MOST IMPACTFUL TAKEAWAY FROM TODAY'S EVENT?
