### HONOREE

Representative James Talarico is a former public-school teacher first elected to serve in the Texas House of Representatives in 2018. He earned degrees from The University of Texas at Austin and Harvard University and currently sits on the Public Education Committee, the Juvenile Justice and Family Issues Committee, and the Calendars Committee. Representative Talarico has worked tirelessly to ensure all Texas students have access to a quality education. In his first term, he helped write the most significant reform to the state's school finance system in 20 years. He went on to pass major legislation to open millions of dollars for student mental health and character education programs, establish the first-ever cap on Pre-K class sizes to reduce student-to-teacher ratios, and improve the quality and affordability of childcare. For his many accomplishments, he was named one of the Top 10 Best Legislators by Texas Monthly magazine.

### HONOREE

Mark A. Wallace, who was appointed President and CEO of Texas Children's Hospital at 36 in 1989, led the hospital through transformative growth, adding over 10 million square feet and establishing two community hospitals—West Campus and The Woodlands. In 2012, he expanded services by opening the Pavilion for Women, integrating women's health within the pediatric system. In February 2024, under his guidance, Texas Children's opened a 365,000-squarefoot hospital in North Austin, extending its reach to Texas's capital.

Known for his approachable leadership, Mark often connected with front-line staff, patients, and families to ensure Texas Children's delivered the highest quality care. After 35 years as the longest-serving CEO in the Texas Medical Center, he retired on October 4, 2024, marking the close of an extraordinary tenure. His legacy is one of unmatched dedication to advancing pediatric and women's health across Texas.
