ABOUT THE INTERNSHIP

C@R is offering an unpaid, but extraordinary learning opportunity for development focused individuals. The Development Interns will have the opportunity to learn from experienced development professionals and work on the essentials of non-profit development work. This is a unique position that will enable the selected candidates to understand the day-to-day operations of a highly successful, macro-level non-profit organization. The preferred candidates will be enthusiastic, detail oriented, and self-motivated individuals driven by a passion for improving the life of children. The Development Interns will join a driven and dynamic team and will work closely with the development office in the areas of special events, individual giving, and resource development.

The internship will be remote with virtual meetings; additionally, the intern may be expected to attend in-person events and meetings as needed.

Key Responsibilities

The intern may support the Development department in any one of these areas noted below:

• Identifying potential donors: Researching and prospecting for new donors, including individuals, foundations, and corporations.

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- **Donor cultivation:** Support in maintaining relationships with current donors through personalized communication and engagement strategies.
- **Grant writing:** Help with initial drafts on small foundation or corporate grants and assist in proofreading proposals and grant applications.
- **Donor stewardship:** Maintaining ongoing communication with donors to express gratitude and update them on the impact of their contributions.
- Database support: Maintain and update Donor Perfect database donor records
- Event planning and execution: Assist the development team in special event planning and resource development for upcoming events, including logistic planning and auction item acquisition.
- **Research**: Research potential third party partnership opportunities.
- Marketing: Assist with material design to enhance donor engagement.
- Any other duties as assigned.

Preferred Qualifications

We are seeking dedicated and focused candidates that possess excellent research, writing or data analysis skills to assist in research and advocacy efforts across C@R issue areas. A passion for social justice is essential, and the belief that all children should be afforded the highest quality of life.

- Ability to work independently as a self-starter, as well as a team member.
- Strong written and verbal communication skills for both internal and external audiences.
- Attention to detail and a commitment to maintaining accurate, confidential donor records.
- A strong work ethic, an outgoing personality, and a zeal for relationship building are all considered a plus for this position.
- A commitment to children, innovative public policy, and positive change preferred.
- A strong desire to learn about fundraising, special events, and grant writing.
