

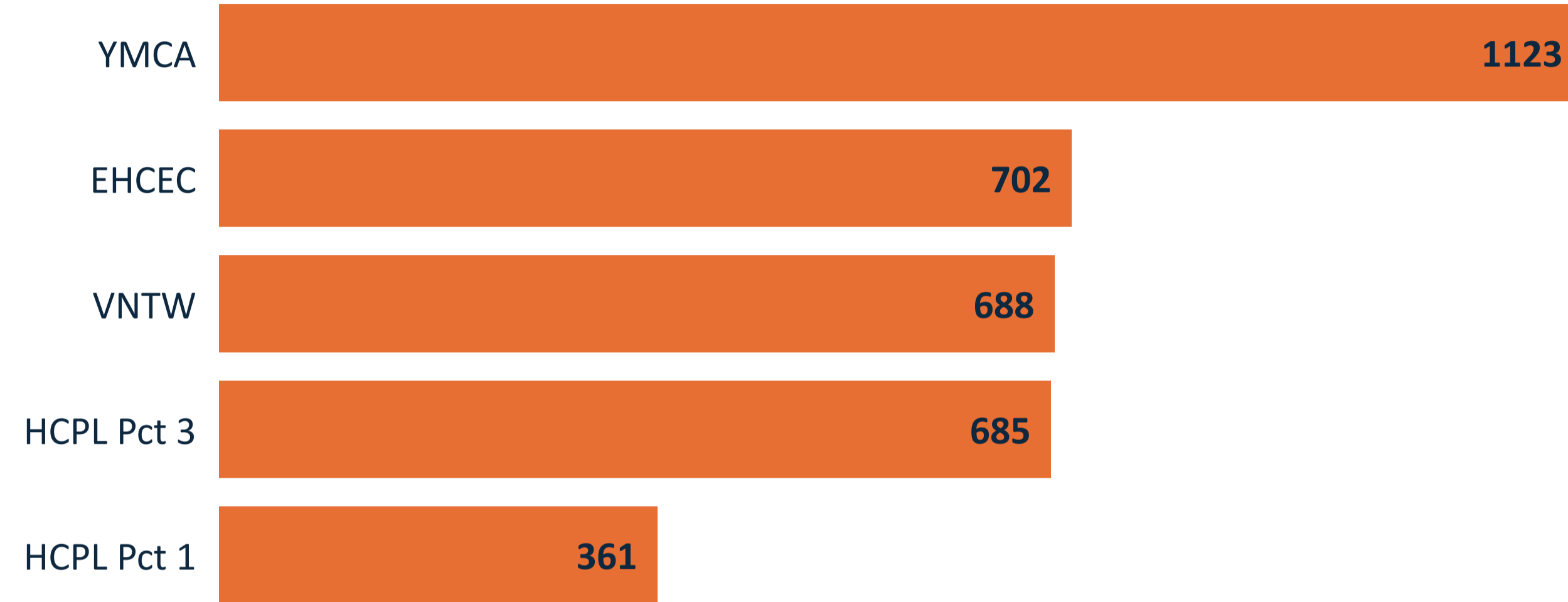

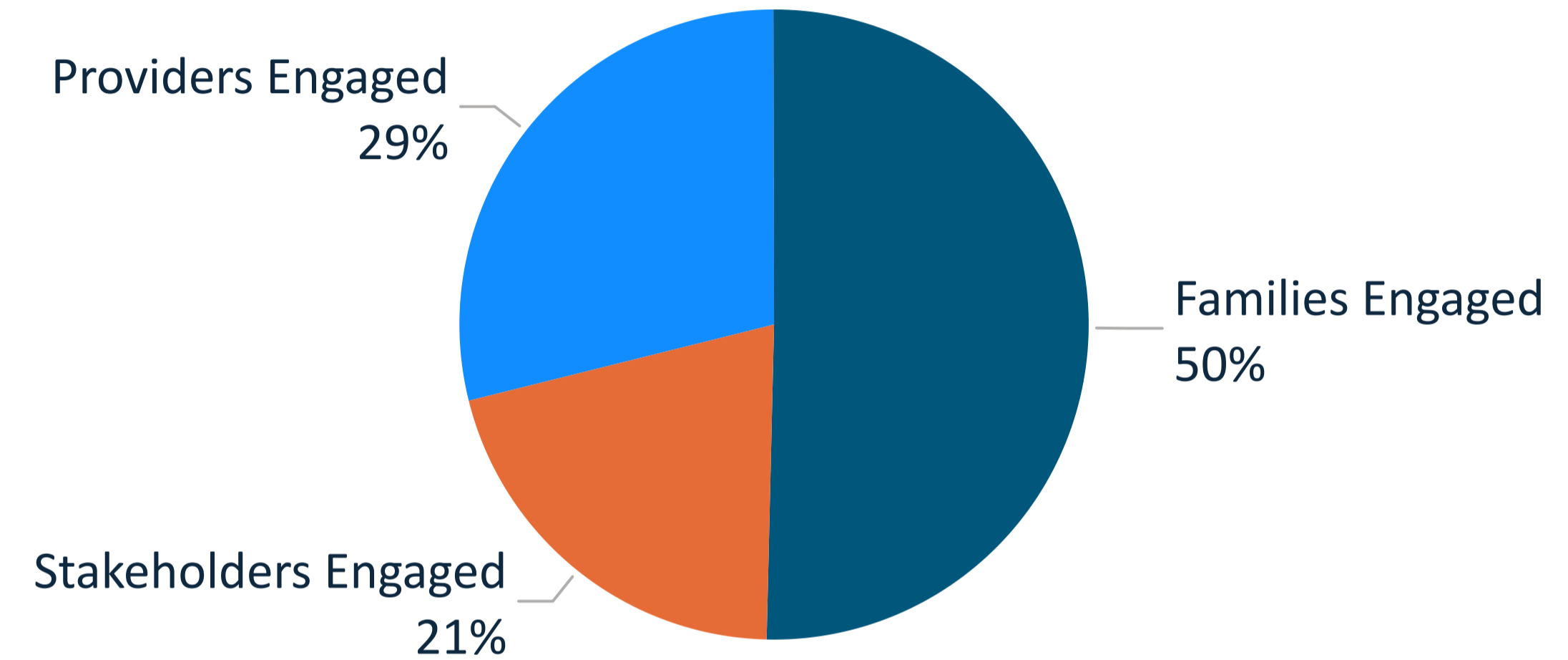

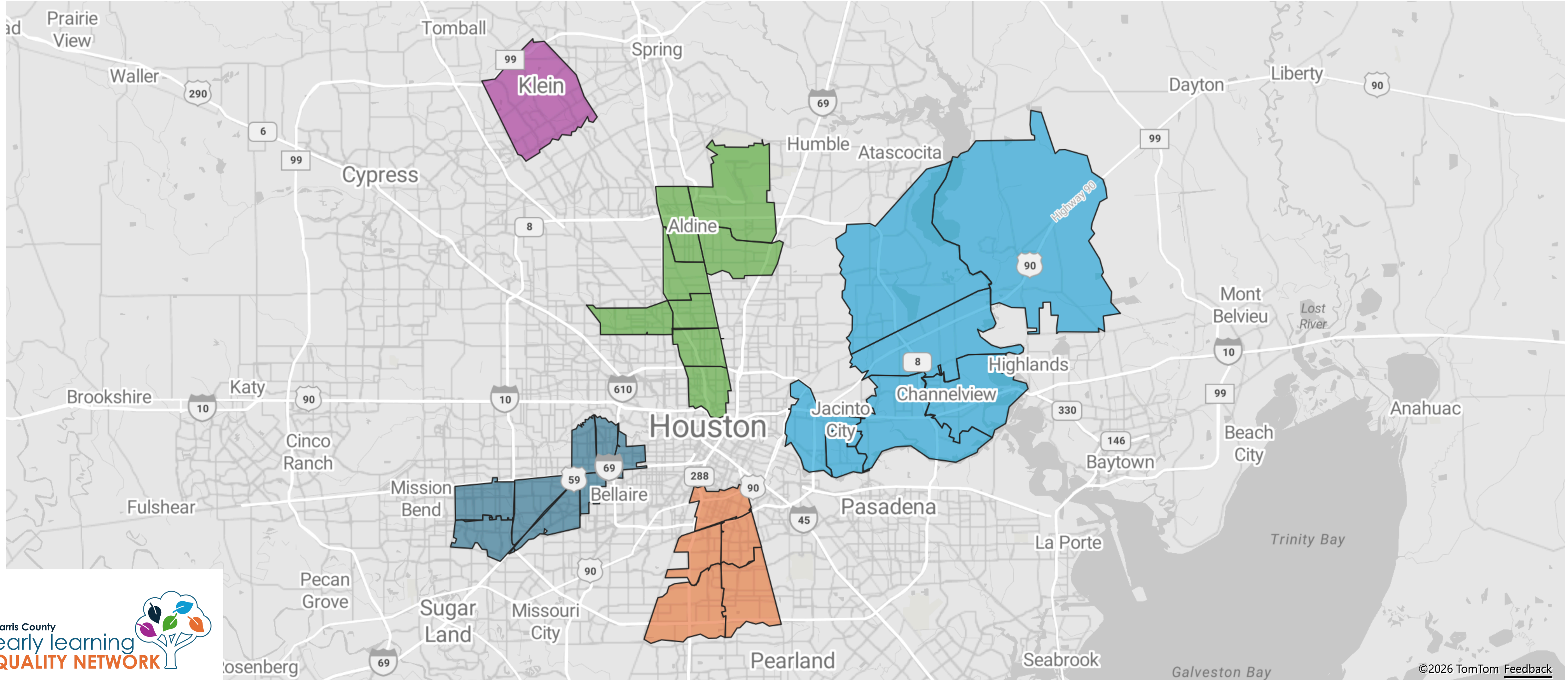

Who are the Local Network Organizations (LNOs)?

- East Harris County Empowerment Council (EHCEC): Precinct 2 - 77015, 77029, 77030, 77032, 77044, 77047, and 77049.
- Harris County Public Library (HCPL): Precinct 1 - 77021, 77033, 77047, 77048, 77051.
- Harris County Public Library (HCPL): Precinct 3 - 77379.
- VN TeamWork, Inc. (VNTW): Precinct 4 - 77027, 77036, 77056, 77057, 77072, 77074, 77081, and 77099.
- YMCA of Greater Houston (YMCA): Precinct 2 - 77009, 77022, 77032, 77037, 77039, 77060, 77076, and 77091.

How are Community Members Defined?

- FAMILIES: **Families** with young children are defined as the **primary caretaker** of a child(ren) from birth-8 years old.
- PROVIDERS: **Regulated providers** are defined as child care providers that are **licensed or registered with CCR**. These providers can be center-based or home-based. **Family, Friend and Neighbor (FFN)** providers are defined as **non-professionals who provide care to a child** and have a relationship with the child's family.
- STAKEHOLDERS: **Early learning stakeholders** are defined as stakeholders that **participate in Federal, State, and Local early childhood and education programs**, or have interactions in the **education system** but do not have a Child Care Regulation license. *Examples of these stakeholders include but are not limited to: nanny, other paid child care providers, Public PreK programs, after school programs, churches, community centers, charters and private schools, home school co-ops, etc.*

How are Community Members Engaged?

- Community members are engaged through various ELQN activities including, but not limited to, community town halls, focus groups, one-on-one conversations, and surveys. Advisory Committees comprising community representatives were also formed to guide the development of the community-specific Child Care Quality Action Plans.
